Prestoungrange Arts Festival (2006) Limited Directors Report for the year ended 31st December 2013

The year's activities were dominated by the creation of the Scottish Diaspora Tapestry across the globe with the support of grants from the Scottish Government, Creative Scotland and Bord na Gaidhlig. All was on schedule at year end 2013 for the launch into Homecoming 2014 during 3 Harbours Festival on May 31st.

Restoration work continued on the murals many of which are now approaching 10 years old. An experimental presentation of Kate Hunter's Salt Mural on canvas was created and will be hung later in the year.

The Burriss Bursary Awards continued to be held via tenancies in the Pottery Workshops rented from East Lothian Council. Exhibitions have continued to be held at The Prestoungrange Gothenburg. Arts Classes also continue independently at the third workshop.

Further grants have been applied for so that the Scottish Diaspora Tapestry can be completed by May 31st 2015 and thereafter commence an international tour beginning in the Baltic and Western Europe.

A volunteer group, Friends of the Tapestries, has been recruited to assist with staffing exhibitions for both the Scottish Diaspora tapestry and the Prestonpans Tapestry.

Results

The operating surplus for the year amounted to £1,240.

Members and their interests

The company is limited by guarantee and has no share capital. Members of the company have agreed to pay an initial guarantee sum of £10, which is held separately in the accounts, along with an annual subscription.
